

As Spring approaches with the tax deadline, I'm always reminded of my New Year's resolution to save more, do more with less, make do with what I have, etc. you know the drill!! I've run across some interesting websites that do offer some great ideas an suggestions- and they are free!! Check them out and let me know what you think! Fabric.com is one of my recent findings and certainly one of my favorites. Although I have not ordered any fabric from them, their site is quite active with ideas, suggestions, samples of items their staff have made, sales, and just useful information in a very upbeat and inviting way. But one of the coolest things on their site is the FREE PATTERN section! There are not only garments to sew, but knitting and crochet items as well. Although it may take a small forest to print off one of the patterns that you will then tape together, the idea of a 'free' pattern is appealing to me. You can also follow them on Facebook and they have a very active posting with suggestions and things going on with their website. Check it out!

Peggy Sagers from Silhouettepatterns.com has started video broadcasts that are free. Typically, they are on a Monday night for about an hour. You sign up on her website and will receive notification on when then next segment will be shown. She did an incredible segment on fitting pants a couple of weeks ago and the most recent one I watched was on constructing T -shirts. Some of you may remember when we hosted her here in OKC for a pants fitting workshop and style show. She is a wonderful teacher and really explains fit and patterns like no one else. I always learn something from her! So what's better than watching a seminar on the computer without leaving your house! Her previous broadcasts are on her website for you to view anytime.

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will find the information about Nancy Nix-Rice and the launch of her weekly posts on wardrobe makeovers-"A New You in 52". I attended her seminar at ASG in Chicago a couple years ago and she has some great ideas of organizing your closet, color analysis, and how to get more from the garments you have. On her website you can sign up for the weekly email.

Another website I've found particularly useful with my love of sewing garments is patternreview.com. This website is interactive from other sewers from all over the world who have reviewed patterns, posted pictures of their garments, and have references and referrals of all matters sewing related. Although you sign up to log on to this site, it's well worth the time. Patterns are expensive. Even with the sales at the fabric stores, there is no reason to buy a pattern I'm not going to make (yeah, right!), but I have found other patterns on here to check out, or mark off my list.

I could go on and on, and will try to add to this in each newsletter, but don't forget the ASG.org website. The monthly broadcasts courtesy of embroidery.com have been great. Ramona Baird has done a great job of selecting a variety of topics and speakers. All this takes is the time to register. Even if you can't watch the live broadcasts, because you have registered, you can go back and watch at your leisure.

Nancy Zieman with nancysnotions.com is offering free patterns and ideas on a email blast. I made one of the cool new pieces of zipper jewelry from a free pattern on her website. Great way to use those old zippers that you are not going to put into a garment because they are the wrong size or wrong color, but would work great as a pin or accent for a necklace!

I can't close without mentioning all the great discounts and offers from the retailers who advertise on the asg.org website, as well as our own OKC retailers. This is part of the 'goodies' that come to you from being an ASG member. I took advantage of the Kia Scissors offer thru ASG and purchased an awesome pair of scissors at 20% off and free shipping!! They are a dream to cut with!! Maybe I can actually MAKE something!!


Community Service




A piece of yarn walks into a bar and orders a beer, but the bartender snarls, "We don't serve your kind here!". The yarn is forced to leave.
