Don't forget you can earn ASG Bucks when you bring in a new member.



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

Follow directions for preparation
Add 4 Tablespoons of Creme de Menthe
Fold in and put in a 9 x 13" pan.
Bake as instructed for a 9 X 13" pan

While the cake is hot spread a jar of chocolate fudge topping (slightly warmed for ease in spreading) over the cake.

Cool

Take 8-12 oz. of Cool Whip and fold in 4 Tablespoons of Creme de Menthe and spread over the chocolate topping. Enjoy!


