
Community Service Project Update

Tool Tip:

Half square triangles can be very time consuming and sometimes tedious. But last fall at the

International Quilt Festival, I found the answer. The Triangle Genie. It's a ruler that let's you mark the strip of fabric the size you need the triangles to be. Then you just sew 1/4" next to the diagonal lines you've drawn and then cut them apart on the diagonal and verticl lines. Super easy and super fast. Check out the video here.


