


“Edmond Quilt Festival 2014”

Edmond Quilt Guild announces “Edmond Quilt Festival 2014” quilt show to be held at Gaylord University Center on the campus of Oklahoma Christian University, 2501 E. Memorial Road in Edmond, Oklahoma on July 25 and 26 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is \$7 and parking is free. The event is open to the public and will display more than 100 quilts made by guild members. There will be dozens of door prizes, an artisan market, vendors and a quilt raffle on Saturday afternoon.

The quilts vary from innovative art to traditional, large to small, pictorial to graphic. Everyone is encouraged to choose their favorite and a Viewer’s Choice Ribbon will be awarded at the conclusion of the show. Quilt entries will be judged by Judy Taylor, a National Association Certified judge and Marla Kelsey, a National Association Certified Judge Candidate. In addition, a special Founders Ribbon will be awarded by Alice Kellogg, found of the Edmond Quilt Guild.
