Tips from readers: American Patchwork & Quilting

(from 'Lake County Material Girls' ASG Lake County Chapter)

No More Tangles: To ensure you never have to unravel a tangled mess of hand embroidery thread, unwind a new skein and wrap it around an old spool. (for this, spools with clamp-down tops works best.) (Pat Chavez– Escalante, Utah)

Lacy Labels: Buy doilies (many of which have lace and gorgeous embroidery) at antiques shops to use as labels. Back them with white flannel, then hand embroider or free motion to label the information. (Sue Mullane– Albuquerque, NM)

Bits of Batting: After trimming the batting for quilts, sew the leftover strips together using a zigzag stitch. The recycled batting is great for baby quilts or small scrappy throws. (Sue Panos– Waucoma, Iowa)

Weight Lifting: When quilting or sewing the binding on a large quilt, position your ironing board next to your sewing machine to support the weight of the quilt while you work. (Kathy Love– El Cajon, California)

Leave No Trace: When cutting out fabric for a quilt project, place a piece of tracing paper over the pattern's cutting instructions. As you go along, use a pencil to cross out each fabric so you don't lose track of where you are, plus you keep your pattern clean! (Shellie Moniz– Johnston, Rhode Island)

Rainbow of Bobbins: Because you sew with colors other than gray and ecru, you have a drawer of partially filled bobbins in many colors. Use these bobbins when making a scrappy quilt. (Bonnie Cramer– Glendo, Wyoming)


