This quarter's programs are shaping up to be wonderful:

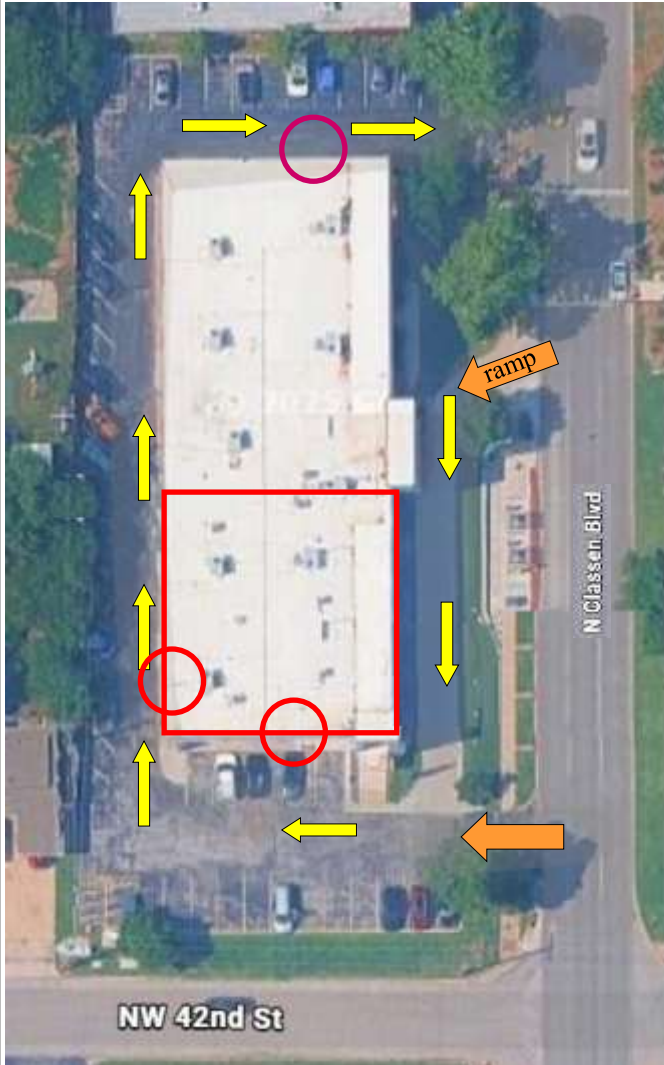

Lastly, if you are at all interested in machine embroidery, there is a new small group forming that needs your input, participation and support.

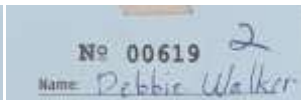
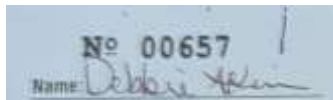

Anyone is welcome to come and sew anything. We will have a group project on machine embroidery.

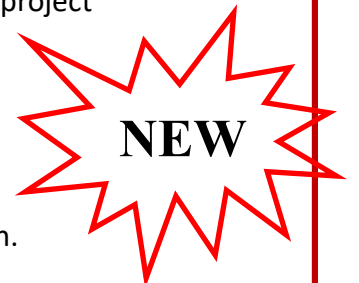

### Chapter Meetings

Think of a chapter as a community of people who are excited about sewing. All kinds of people! Some with advanced or professional sewing skills, some novices at the beginner level, and the majority who fall somewhere between those two levels. They want to learn new skills, they want sewing friends to share their successes and challenges, and they want to belong to a group that will support their adventures in sewing.

Chapters come in all sizes - larger chapters often sponsor quarterly chapter-wide special events that may feature local or national speakers, member fashion shows, or specialty workshops. Some chapters also sponsor many smaller neighborhood or special interest groups within the larger structure which meet more frequently (usually monthly). Smaller chapters may meet on a monthly basis as one group. 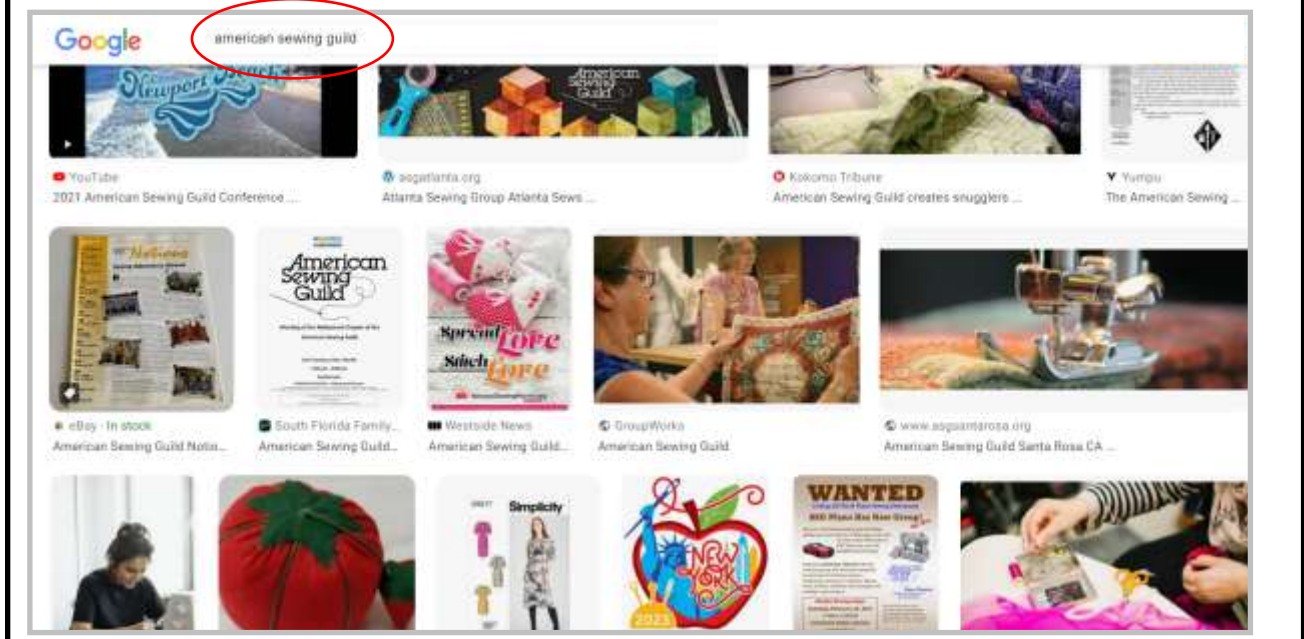

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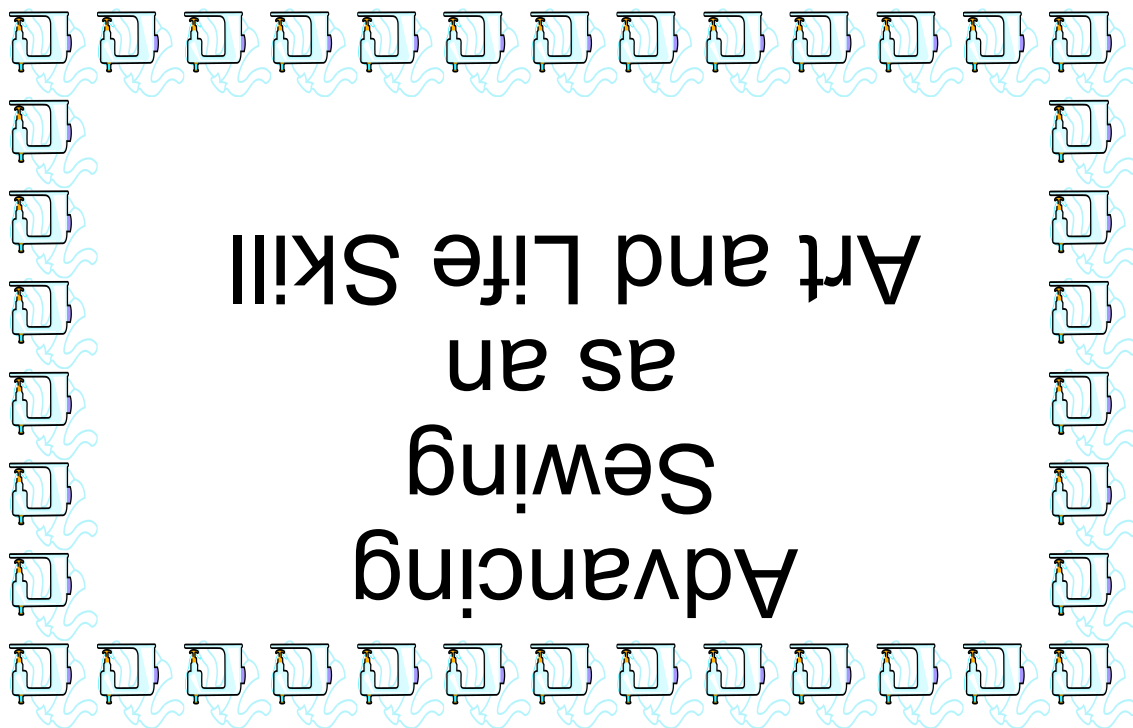
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## Membership Information
