Betty Beryle Warren
JANUARY 25, 1933 – JANUARY 8, 2024

Today would have been Bebe's 91st birthday!

A couple of weeks ago, over Christmas, I was at Papa and Bebe's house, and casually on the closet door knob hung Bebe's college graduation tassel. It seemed misplaced, that's probably not where it belongs, yet here it was. As I stood there looking at it, I realized that tassel was monumentally important in the woman I am today, and it just hung there so nonchalantly on the closet door. That tassel represented so much to Bebe and the life she created for herself, and in turn how that impacted me.



I don't know where the desire came from, but when Bebe was a young mother, she knew she needed to go get a degree. When I would call and check in with her on Saturdays in college, she would remind me how silly she thought it was that she was still required to take a P.E. class in college. While raising two kids, she got her degree and stepped into her own career as a school librarian. I think she was tired of reading all of the books by the time I came along because I only ever saw her read the newspaper.

Her quest for education instilled in my mom that a college degree was within reach. In the late 70's, a woman in engineering was rare. Actually, there were only two females in my mom's engineering class. That tenacity came straight from Bebe. Believing that if you put your mind to it, you could do anything! I never remember a time when higher education wasn't part of the family plan for me. I know it's not the best path for everyone, but in our household, college was a "when", not an "if" - and that was Bebe. She couldn't have been more proud that I also followed in her steps to get a master's degree, now having my own collection of graduation tassels. I don't know if that would have been in the cards for me if it wasn't for her first tassel.

That was Bebe.

She was deeply committed to her family and so generous to help their dreams come true. For 12 years, she helped pay for my piano lessons.

That was Bebe.

She spent countless hours sewing bags and purses and sweaters to have the right colors to support the right team at that ball game. And then she went to as many games as she could. Who knows if she actually liked the sport - but she was there, dressed in the team colors - to support her grandkids all the way.

That was Bebe.

No outfit was ever quite right without enough sparkle - and red lips. Some would say she never had enough sparkle. The shinier the better. The brighter the red, the better.

That was Bebe.

Bebe had a way of both worrying about things, and knowing that things would be fine. In so many of our conversations, she would remind me that "things work out, they have a way of doing that!"

That was Bebe, too.

Over Christmas, to hold the hand of the woman whose life so impacted mine, saying Thank You felt small. So in my mind, I spoke a version of the blessing my parents would say to me before going to sleep from Deuteronomy:

The Lord has blessed you, and has kept you.

The Lord has made his face shine and sparkle bright upon you, and has been gracious to you.

The Lord has lifted up his countenance upon you - - and now has brought you Peace.
