Annual OKCASG Retreat Report May 8, 2017

The Oklahoma City Chapter of the American Sewing Guild started off the spring sewing season with a trip to Red Rock Canyon Camp on May 5-7 for their annual retreat. Approximately 43 dedicated seamstresses attended the retreat, demonstrating their addiction to sewing by using creative thinking and mind-boggling sewing skills. It was

Adding to those who are members of the Oklahoma City guild, one retreator came from Wichita, Kansas while two others made their way north from Amarillo, Texas and one from Wylie, Texas. 




