FAREWELL DEAR FRIENDS

In 1963, Helen Enox was retiring from Tinker Air Force Base and about to embark on a second career that would fulfill a lifetime dream. A self-taught and talented seamstress, she and her husband Jack began a business with seventeen bolts of fabric that would grow to become Oklahoma's largest independent fabric store. Always featuring superb quality textiles and the highest level of customer service, Helen's Fabrics became a Southside fixture in Oklahoma City for generations of brides and those seeking the very finest in fashion fabrics. For 44 years Helen's dedication and passion for quality, detail, and the highest standards endeared her to the many thousands of customers who came through her doors, often establishing friendships that would last a lifetime. Helen departed this world as a result of a medical emergency she experienced in her beloved store, and Jack and their daughter Charlotte continued her work until they too joined Helen in 2014. At that time, I was blessed with the opportunity to continue Helen's legacy through my marriage to Beverly, Helen's beloved niece. Knowing nothing about the fabric business, we endeavored to continue in Helen's footsteps with the capable assistance of long time employees such as Carolyn, Ruth Ann, Vicki, Gayla and others, always striving to fill the very large shoes of a very small woman.

Over the last several years, I have been regaled with countless stories of Helen's kindness and compassion, from granting credit on meager payment terms to help mothers clothe their families to trusting fledgling vendors with advance payment for large fabric orders to give them a critical helping hand. Having known Helen myself for many years, these did not surprise me, but their frequency did. Helen truly was cut from a very special bolt, an interwoven fabric of family, love, and enduring faith and trust.

After 55 continuous years of service, Helen Enox Fine Fabrics will close for the last time in June, 2018. It has been my distinct honor and privilege to add a small footnote to the legacy of such a fine and compassionate human being.

On behalf of Helen Enox and family, the remaining and former employees of Helen Enox Fabrics, my wife Beverly and myself, thank you for your support over the last half century.

Who doesn't want to talk about their sewing obsession, share their latest projects. If your non-sewing friends get a glazed look in their eyes when you talk about your latest fabric score or your embroidery triumph, then you need to find a sewing group, Here are just a few more ideas why you should join one.

- A. A place to develop skills. Many are based on the premise of continuous learning new monthly projects to work on and include the tradition of "show and tell" so much fun to see how each member's creativity and personality showed up in the last month's project. All members are happy to help if someone would like assistance with a particular technique.
- B. Giving Back. If you are interested in helping in your community many sewing groups or individual members are involved in making thing for charity organizations, great place to learn what's needed in your community.
- C. Learn about new resources. Members love to share where to find out about new resources for fabrics, craft supplies and patterns, whether it's an undiscovered fabric store to a new pattern or online sites.

We love to share our ideas and you'll go home with dozen new ideas to use.
- F. Fun. Communicating with like-minded fanatics to discuss all things sewing, embroidery, and crafting. Neighborhood groups are a warm and happy place to stretching yourself with new challenges. I always leave a meeting with renewed energy, there's always something to learn when it comes to all things sewing.

Sewing Advice

THEN	NOW
Prepare yourself mentally for sewing.	Wake up.
Think about what you are going to do.	Always keep a good stash of fabrics, patterns and notions ready so you can sew whatever you want, whenever the mood strikes.
Never approach sewing with a sigh or lackadaisically.	Save that attitude for housework.
Good results are difficult when indifference predominates.	Indifference is great when mending, repairing zippers, or shortening pants. If the results aren't good, people will stop asking.
Never try to sew with a sink full of dirty dishes or beds unmade.	This is good advice only if you sew with your machine in the sink or on the bed.
When there are urgent housekeeping chores, do these first so your mind is free to enjoy your sewing.	There are no urgent housekeeping chores. Just enjoy your sewing.
When you sew, make yourself as attractive as possible.	Never buy a sewing machine with a mirror in it.
Put on a clean dress.	You may sew in your jammies, but wear slippers. Otherwise, your feet will get dusty.
Keep a little bag full of French chalk near your sewing machine to dust your fingers at intervals.	What?
Have your hair in order, powder and lipstick put on.	Brush your teeth, if time permits and you remember.
If you are constantly fearful that a visitor will drop in or your husband will come home, and you will not look neatly put together, you will not enjoy your sewing.	Lock the door and don't answer the phone. If your husband comes home, you really can't refuse to let him in, but leave a number where he can order takeout.
