Ideas from ASG Springfield Lincolnland Sew Whats New "TOOL TIME" by Rene Gallaher

Need to pick up some aids on the cheap? Check out the dollar store.

Extra large zipper bags- keeps all your stuff together for your projects

Shelf gripper liner-to keep your foot pedal from skipping around

Lint roller- to pick up those tiny threads that collect on your sewing table, ironing board and quilt tops

Flannel backed tablecloth- toss it in hot dryer for 5 minutes then tape it to the wall for a design wall

Tacky palm working gloves- for free motion quilting

Paint or makeup brushes- to clean your sewing machine

Cuticle sticks or bamboo skewers or large BBQ sticks- as stiletto or place under buttons before you sew it to give it height

Flexible chopping board- subs for template plastic

First aid tape- it has some texture to it, place it on your rulers to keep them from slipping Silicon sheets- use under your pressing surface when using interfacing

Super glue- you can apply a dab on the tip of your finger to act as a thimble when done just peel it off

Crochet hook- having trouble getting thread through a bobbin use a #13 steel crochet hook

Mallets for leather, vinyl, and grommet work

Scissors

Great clamps

4-inch magnetic car parts holders. You can personalize it in whatever color you want Metal magnetic strips to hold your tools

How do you keep track of all your sewing projects?

Keeping a sewing planner is a great way to keep track of the patterns you have sewn. The following is a list of apps for you to check out. (some of these may only be available on apple devices.)

Pattern Box

Along with keeping track of your patterns it lets you keep track of your fabric inventory, notions you have on hand and projects you are working on.

Cora-Sew Your Fabric Stash

Helps fabric lovers stay organized and sew their stashes, your fabric stash is always with you.

Stash Star

Lets you track all your creative projects from quilting to woodworking, sewing to ceramics.

Sew Organized

Organize your fabric. Search your fabric stash by name, fabric type, size and more. Maintain records of washing instructions on your fabric purchases. Organize your sewing patterns. Search your patterns by name, type and more. Track measurements for everyone you sew for. Create a sewing shopping list. Maintain a list of works in progress so you don't leave projects unfinished.

Isewme (all one word)

Provides creation of projects and associated people, fabric, patterns, stock, documents, and photos, creation of people and their measurements, addition of fabric, addition of patterns, accounting of stock and addition of notes.

How many thimbles do you have or collect? Here's some thimble trivia...

In the Parker Brothers board game Monopoly, first created in 1904, the thimble was one of the eight traditional metal pieces. However, in 2017 it was retired. Thimbles are given as gifts in "Peter Pan", who thinks they are kisses. In the 1992 movie "Batman Returns", Cat woman used thimbles to create the base of her claws. The popular TV show and comic strip "Popeye" was originally called "Thimble Theater Starring Popeye". The character "Elizabeth" in the video game "BioShock Infinite" uses a thimble to cover her severed finger. Video montages and series of clips are often called "Thimble collections". In the 2000 movie "Chicken Run", "Nick" and "Fetcher" attempted to sell a couple of thimbles to "Ginger" as a quality, hand crafted tea set.

A beautiful reason to keep a sewing journal. You're not necessarily keeping it just for yourself but also for those that follow you. Think of that one special item that you treasure that someone made for you. Wouldn't you love to hear the story of this item? Tell your stories in your sewing journal!

Bring: Your own sewing projects. Sewing machine. Scissors and/or Rotary cutter.


Measuring instruments. Pins. Needles. Extension cords. Lamp or light and any other sewing supplies you need.




