Interview with Betty Gresham, 1st President of OKCASG in 1991) April 15th 2021 by Jana Burgess, Marilyn Marusa, and Marla Sue Sweaney.

First meetings were at Penn Square Mall (downstairs near the mall offices) in Oklahoma City. We got the room for free but Gina Butler and I had to sign our lives away. If any damage had been done me and Gina would have had to foot the bill for it. The room held 300 people. Really a nice place. We had to get either 13 or 16 retailers that had to do with sewing to sign up and back us basically and mostly what they did was give everyone a 10% discount. I was one of the retailers and Gina was one of the retailers.



Gina's business was embroidering and mine was tailoring. We went to see Mr. Ely, who was the head honcho over all districts of Hancocks Fabrics. He said, you know I've heard a lot about you. Hancocks will not let me do that but I want you to know you have my open check book. We about fainted.

We had a lot of good retailers. We had Helen Enox and Carolyn Humphrey who did a lot of programs. In the beginning we couldn't afford to hire someone to do programs. Gina or I would take every other month doing programs We would make them something. Looking back I think these people sew like crazy and we are giving them



something we sewed. They probably were not thrilled but they kept coming back. When we did have speakers come from a distance they would stay at my house. My house was not the neatest because I am a sewer. I did a lot of sewing out of my home then...

Do you want to know how I became President? No body else would do it. Tag you're it. I was President longer than I was supposed to be because we couldn't get anyone else to run. It was a lot of work getting the retailers to back us. We needed this in order for ASG Headquarters to accept us as a chapter.

Jana asked Betty about a picture where she was using a crutch. Betty said she remembered the lady that spoke about sewing with chiffon fabric but she did not remember what she did to her foot!

Betty and Gina were both in the Machine Embroidery Guild during the day so they thought they needed something at night.



Emma Grist did a whole lot of leg work and never takes any credit. I did not even having a dinning table at that time and we would sit on the floor and fold packets and bags for all the different events we did. She also advertised our events very well because she worked at Hancocks. She got the word out. She would tell everyone about Betty's classes at Francis Tuttle Technology Center. She would tell everyone, be wary when Betty lets you have a break. I would cut all of the serger threads so everyone would come back and have to re-thread their sergers.! Betty teaches how to use all kinds of sergers. Betty taught at Bernina, Babylock, Pfaff, and Singer. They wouldn't let her teach other brands of sergers so she went to Francis Tuttle. She used to teach only one night a week but now she teaches three nights a week because she is retired. Her boss told her if you teach them how to use their sergers they are not going to come and buy a _____. Betty said if they don't learn to use the serger they have they are going to throw it in the trash and never buy another one. Betty said 90% of sergers are made by Juki even though they have different brand names on them. The only one that is different is Babylock. When she sold Babylock they came out with the machine that was like a professional machine. Home sewers were not used to that. Home sewers are taught to not touch the tension. The Babylock tension knob would go around and around. It was very easy for them to do that several times and not be able to figure out how to get back. Babylock did not make a very good impression with the first 3 or 4 sergers they came out with.

Betty says she does not think there is a bad serger on the market now. When you shop for a serger always take some fabric or a project you are working on. Let them show you the machine then make sure you get a chance to sew on it with your fabric. If they don't want you to do that, walk away. Another pet peeve Betty has is no mater what problem you are having the mechanics will says it's something you did.

We talked about the ASG Conference in San Antonio, she talked about going to San Antonio by Amtrak train for her Grandson's wedding. We all thought it might be fun to ride the train down there for the conference in 2022!

Betty was looking at the pictures and said she saw Linda Bray who was a police officer. Linda did her a big favor. We talked about Marilyn Highley. Betty remembered her shop "The French Seam". They

were one of the sponsors of ASG. Betty said several members came from out of town. Pat Geddes came from Purcel, OK. Gail and Coy Bush came from Chickasha, OK. The brownie group in the pictures were from Yukon.

Betty said she always encourages her students to visit the ASG meetings.

Shirley Adams stayed at Betty's house. ASG rented a building from an oil company for the event. The oil company went bust so she had to find a place quick. She called in a favor from her preacher and rented the church sanctuary. He got in trouble about it. They already had a call chain setup. By phone calls they notified 300 people of the venue change. They only lost 2 people! It was very dark for sewing so they used the spot light and burned it out. The church members want to come in for free but Betty told them no. ASG members have to pay and she is a paid speaker. Betty and Marla talked about Shirley Adams and Nancy Zieman. How similar kind and knowledgeable. Betty has everyone of Shirley Adams' books.

When Betty was told she needed to go to the ASG Headquarters' Conference in 1992, she told them I don't fly. Her husband drove her. It was in Las Vegas. OKCASG member, Theta Harp, went too. She was teaching at the conference. That helped keep the cost down.

Eventually Penn Square needed that space for offices and so the chapter moved to the Warr Acres Community Center.






