



Have you ever asked yourself why join a neighborhood group?

Who doesn't want to talk about their sewing obsession, share their latest projects. If your non-sewing friends get a glazed look in their eyes when you talk about your latest fabric score or your embroidery triumph, then you need to find a sewing group, Here are just a few more ideas why you should join one.

- A. A place to develop skills. Many are based on the premise of continuous learning new monthly projects to work on and include the tradition of "show and tell" so much fun to see how each member's creativity and personality showed up in the last month's project. All members are happy to help if someone would like assistance with a particular technique.
- B. Giving Back. If you are interested in helping in your community many sewing groups or individual members are involved in making thing for charity organizations, great place to learn what's needed in your community.
- C. Learn about new resources. Members love to share where to find out about new resources for fabrics, craft supplies and patterns, whether it's an undiscovered fabric store to a new pattern or online sites.
- D. Get feedback or a critique. Want some constructive criticism of a sewing project? Sewing groups are great places to get the feedback you need. That's especially true when garment sewing, getting help and ideas for fit problems is priceless. Getting input from sewing friends can help save a project your ready to trash.
- E. Get suggestions for special fabrics or quilt fabric scraps. Your fellow sewing group members can help you brainstorm just what to do with a special fabric, fabric scraps or craft project leftovers you have been treasuring for ages. We love to share our ideas and you'll go home with dozen new ideas to use.
- F. Fun. Communicating with like-minded fanatics to discuss all things sewing, embroidery, and crafting. Neighborhood groups are a warm and happy place to stretching yourself with new challenges. I always leave a meeting with renewed energy, there's always something to learn when it comes to all things sewing.

Learning How To Buy Fabrics Online By Claire Kennedy

The truth is that brick and mortar stores in all areas of retail are in jeopardy and are short-lived. The best antidote to this is the stores that act as showrooms for their online stores. I know, I can hear you now: I can't feel the fabric; I don't know the right color; it's hard to tell what I'm buying. But the truth is that this IS the way of the future, and we can either go toward the future with our eyes open and learn how to purchase fabric online or buy junk from the big-box stores with less and less of a selection, screaming, kicking and complaining the whole way.

There are some guidelines to help make the transition to online fabric purchasing a little easier.

- 1. ask for samples
- 2. many sites use Pantone color charts get one it will save you a ton of money and answer your questions about color.
- 3. Learn about stretch fabric percentages what works best for your project. As a special help, there's a special down-loadable free gift to help with this:
- http://sewingartistry.com/product/choosing-the-right-stretch-fabric-for-your-project-or-pattern/
- 4. Know your fabrics when it says a heavy-weight wool, this will not drape; a lightweight cotton or rayon will not tailor well, and
- 5. Remember these stores *want* to sell to you; they *want* to develop you as a client; email them; chat with them to ask their help in choosing the right fabric for your project.

That said, here are my insider list of favorite stores to purchase online:

Gorgeous Fabrics https://www.gorgeousfabrics.com - she's moved her site so is restocking so if you don't see what you like, check back often.

Vogue Fabrics Store https://voguefabricsstore.com - Another grand old store in Chicago

Fabrics & Fabrics https://fabrics-fabrics.com - A very upscale store with reasonable prices in NYC Elliott Berman Textiles https://elliottbermantextiles.com - an old-school fine fabric store in NYC

Mendel Goldberg Fabrics https://www.mendelgoldbergfabrics.com - a grand store in the "old" fabric district" of NYC (south of Delancy), and filled with high-end couture fabrics. Check out the *End Cuts* for some deeply discounted exquisite fabric. This is the exact reason you need to learn to buy online - no where else other than designers workroom can you get these fabrics.

Surge Fabric Shop https://www.surgefabricshop.com - looking for stretch fabrics, this is it! Great selection.

Promenade Fine Fabrics https://www.etsy.com/shop/PromenadeFabrics This is their Etsy shop but if you're in New Orleans drop by their brick and mortar - both have fine fabrics.

Marcy Tilton Fabrics https://www.marcytilton.com Yes she designs for Vogue, but she also has killer fabrics and her Cool Combos are not to be missed.

Emma One Sock https://www.emmaonesock.com has many great fabrics from very formal to unique and casual. I do follow a lot of these stores and more on Instagram cause many stores will post "previews" of things just arrived, and you can literally call the shop up and find out more - price, content, etc. I've done this before from all places like Albania, and it came in and was spectacular!

This isn't like going to New York and purchasing the fabric in person, but then it's the same transition we make when we purchase electronics or shoes or something from Amazon. Although we can't return the fabric, and it does take a little practice to make this right, but ask for samples and help with the staff on the phone.

The fact is that we're going to learn to either order online or else be relegated to the limited supplies which are going to dwindle more and more. When you order online, the *world* is your shopping store. And there are sooooooo many beautiful fabrics out there that are even hard to describe their beauty. Please look at some of the sites above and you will be elated at what's available to you.
